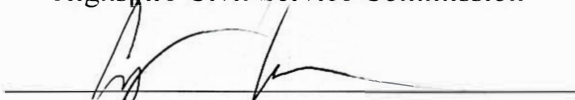

<p>No Heat</p> <p>11/13/25 - Received message from manager Mark stating the manager's office thermostat has a U4 error code.</p> <p>Arrived and verified the system has a U4 error code. Error code U4 is a lost communication error that will appear when the indoor units and outdoor unit loose communication between each other. Verified all indoor units have proper line voltage. Verified condenser on roof has proper voltage. Condenser control board usually has status LED lights illuminated showing system status and/or system errors, but all lights are off. Attempted to force unit into diagnostic mode but outdoor control board is nonresponsive. The condenser main PCB board has failed and requires replacement. While on site, the main system components were tested to see if possibly a failed component caused main board failure. The compressor windings were tested for short circuit or grounding, along with the compressor crankcase heater, reversing valve, and condenser fan motors. Inspected wiring and other controls to see if a wire rubbed through or chaffed but nothing found. The outdoor main PCB board requires replacement for operation.</p> <p>12/18/25 - Arrived and replaced main PCB board. After installing board, startup could not be completed. Main PCB is now active but both condenser fan motors are not communicating or functioning. Place call for Daikin Tech support to verify issue, and the condenser fan motors were confirmed to be what damaged the main PCB. Contacted local distributor and found current condenser fan motors have been superseded to new part numbers. Ordered new fan motors.</p> <p>12/19/25 - Picked up new fan motors and returned for installation. Once new fan motors were installed, the condenser was reassembled. Power was restored to the unit and self-test was performed. This is a function the unit must complete after replacing components to verify operation and calibration. WHEREAS, Section 503 (1) of the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code, as amended, allows for the recovery of costs incurred by the Borough for the costs of processing subdivision applications; and
